What is a Stranger?



A Stranger can be anyone you don't know or you don't know very well.

Most Strangers are nice, but some are nasty and want to hurt children.

They could be a man or woman of any age.

Strangers

You must always remember...

Never:

- **Go with a stranger.**
- **Take things from a stranger.**
- **Get in a car with a stranger.**
- **Go off on your own.**



Always:

- **Play with other children.**

It's safer and more fun to be with friends, but make sure you tell your parents or carer where you are.

Strangers

If someone scares you, or tries to touch you in ways that make you feel uncomfortable.....

‘YELL’... *Tell them ‘No’ or ‘Stop’*

‘RUN’.... *Get home as quick as you can. If you can’t get home, go somewhere you know will be safe, like your school or a police station.*

‘TELL’... *Tell your parents or carer or someone you can trust right away.*

*How loud can you **YELL**?*

Make sure people hear you, if someone scares you!

If you get lost

If you get lost, only approach people that you think you can trust.

These could be:

- A Police Officer
- A Traffic Warden
- A Shopkeeper in a shop
- A Security Guard at a shopping centre.
- Someone that you know.



Try and remember your full name, when you were born and where you live because if you get lost you will need to tell the Police these in order that they can take you home safely.

NEVER tell a **STRANGER** your name or address.

Play Safe

Pick a safe place to play, fools play on roads. Don't be one!
Never play on building sites, empty buildings or railway lines.

Let your parents or carers know where you are and when you will be home.

Always wear a helmet when you're cycling.

Yell if stranger scares you and tell your parents or carer, right away.

Swimming is great fun, but very dangerous. Always be careful.

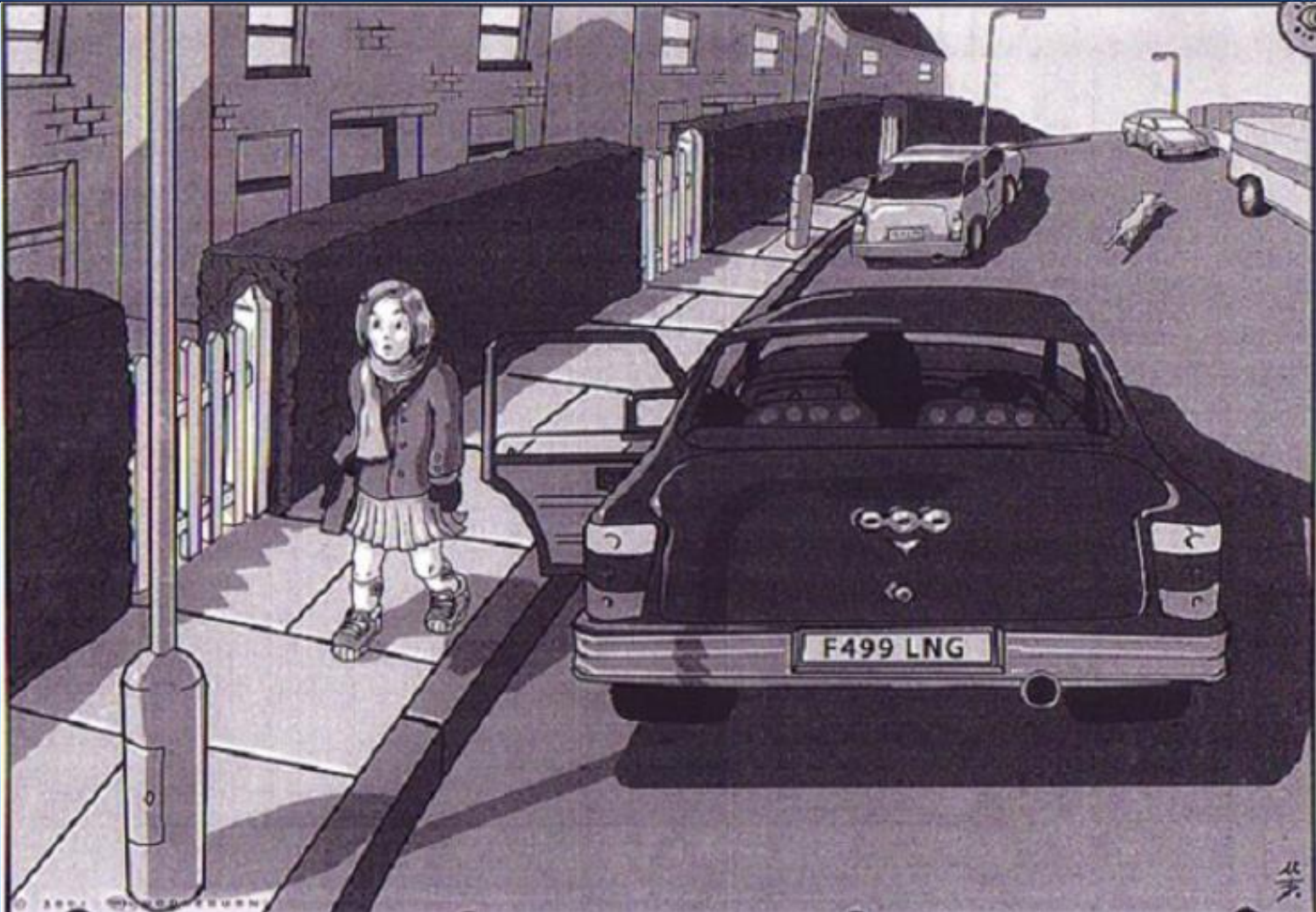
Always use the green cross code (stop, look and listen)

Electricity is dangerous. Don't play near sub-stations or overhead cables.

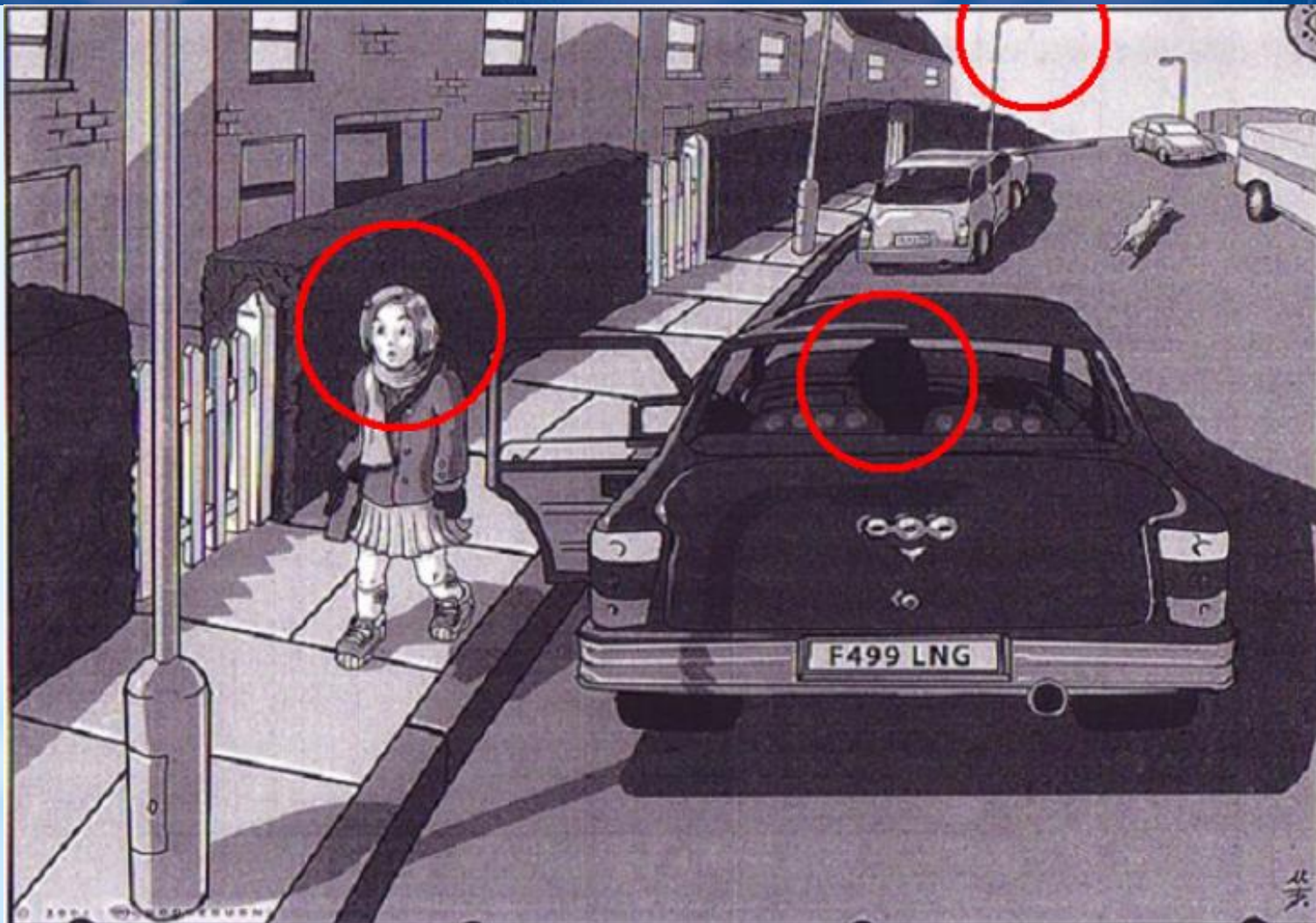
